

Ambassador Norman Eisen (ret.) is a senior fellow in Governance Studies at the Brookings Institution. He is the author or editor of five books and many other publications including the "Guide to Counting Electoral College Votes and the January 6, 2021, Meeting of Congress." He has handled election law matters for over two decades, including serving as co-lead counsel for a presidential recount. Eisen previously served as Special Counsel for Ethics and Government Reform in the Obama White House, as U.S. Ambassador to the Czech Republic and as Special Counsel to the House Judiciary Committee for the first impeachment and trial of Donald Trump. He is the co-founder of Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington, the co-founder and co-chair of the States United Democracy Center, and a CNN legal analyst.
