

Biography: Virginia Kase Solomón, CEO, League of Women Voters of the United States

Virginia Kase Solomón is the CEO of the League of the Women Voters of the United States, a 100-year-old voting rights organization that emerged out of the suffrage movement and continues to empower voters and defend democracy today. In her role as chief executive, Virginia is leading the organization to build power by engaging in advocacy, defending democracy and protecting voters through legislation and litigation, and field organizing to ensure voting rights for all. Prior to joining LWV she served as COO of CASA, an organization at the forefront of the immigrant rights movement, representing nearly 100,000 members. With more than 20 years of experience working in the non-profit sector, Virginia is a leading advocate for participatory elections and democracy. She has testified before Congress on election administration, appeared on various television news programs, published multiple opinion pieces, and is regularly quoted in news articles from Teen Vogue to the New York Times.
